

## **Proper Connections to the Sewer System**

San Andreas Sanitary District has an Ordinance that governs fair and consistent application of its regulations established to protect public health and our local watershed.

Section 3.5 of the Ordinance addresses the issue of connecting vehicles to the sewer system. This includes recreational vehicles, trailers, food trucks, and all other mobile sources of sewage.

Recreational vehicles, such as motor homes or fifth wheels, cannot be connected to a residence unless a permit is requested for adding a bedroom to a residence. Why? Because in a sense, connecting a vehicle that provides sleeping,



restroom and kitchen functions is similar to adding onto the residence; it changes the capacity of the current permit.

Food trucks produce fats, oils, grease, and other substances that need to go through an industrial grease and oil separator before being discharged into the sewer system. Direct connection of food trucks compromises the wastewater treatment system and may jeopardize public health and safety.
