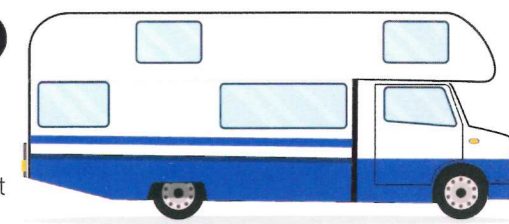


Did you know?

One example is connecting vehicles to the sanitary sewer system.

Clean water: It's what we do!

Section 3.5 of the Ordinance addresses the issue of connecting vehicles to the sewer system. This includes recreational vehicles, trailers, food trucks, and all other mobile sources of sewage.

While it may seem harmless to connect a vehicle to the sanitary sewer system, it is not allowed unless specifically permitted by the District for a few reasons.

Recreational vehicles such as motor homes or fifth wheels cannot be connected to a residence unless a permit is requested for adding a bedroom to a residence. Why? Because in a sense, connecting a vehicle that provides sleeping, restroom and kitchen functions is similar to adding onto the residence; it changes the capacity of the current permit.

Food trucks provide tasty tacos and burgers, but also produce fats, oils, grease, and other substances that need to go through an industrial grease and oil separator before being discharged into the sewer system. Direct connection of food trucks to the sewer compromises the wastewater treatment system and may jeopardize public health and safety.
