A Plant Operator performs a wide variety of technical tasks at the main treatment plant and in the community collection system. The Operator is involved with many initiatives for environmental protection, such as performing laboratory tests at the facility and the river outfall, conducting inspections of commercial establishments, and implementing repairs to process control equipment. Operators in San Andreas implement technical procedures for control of the activated sludge treatment facility, interface with the plant's automation system, facilitate construction work with contractors, perform preventive and corrective maintenance, operate heavy machinery, and provide plant tours for the local schools. This is a challenging and fulfilling career. A full job description is available for all the knowledge, skills, and abilities required.

Candidates need only a High School diploma or equivalent, and a valid California Driver's License to get started in this position. Of course, having related experience and/or having already completed education courses from community college or CSU-Sacramento is a plus.

The entry level wage is \$24.84/hr and progresses to \$46.70/hr based on experience, education, and certification. Benefits include CalPERS retirement, vacation, and medical/dental insurance.
