KEEP YOUR PIPES CLEAN!

Extra holiday cooking, baking and entertaining can place a strain on your pipes!

In the kitchen, most sink clogs are caused by Fats, Oils, Grease (FOG), which are the components found in food items such as butter, oils, gravy, and meat scraps that are rinsed down the drain. Whether during meal prep or washing dishes after a meal, remember to:

- Scrape and dry-wipe plates, mixing bowls, baking dishes, and frying pans into the trash or composting bin.
- Let hot liquids (cooking oils, gravy) cool before pouring in the trash or pour the liquid into a sturdy container to cool, then place in the trash.

Never mix dish soap and hot water with FOG and pour it down your drain! Soon after leaving your sink, the liquid will cool and the FOG will return to a solid that can eventually lead to a clogged pipe and costly sewer back-ups.

In the restroom, remember the toilet is not a trash can! Sanitary products, paper towels, cleaning and hand sanitizing wipes are to be disposed of in the trash, never the toilet. These are not flushable and will cause sewer back-ups.



SAFETY IS KEY – FOR THE WASTEWATER TREATMENT PLANT AND THE COMMUNITY!

The District's employees have implemented safe work practices in a consistent manner for over six plus years of "No Loss Time" caused by workplace accidents. How did the District Staff achieve this level of performance? The District's Employees regularly conduct safety inspections at the lift stations, treatment plant, and the administrative offices, and correct noted deficiencies to maintain a safe work environment. Additionally, employees routinely conduct safety training, including 'tailgates' that highlight specific concerns about conditions in the workplace. Staff also participate in various safety training events, such as confined space awareness and respiratory protection, to stay compliant with Cal-OSHA regulations. Creating and maintaining a safe work environment requires consistent effort and attention to detail. These efforts are well worth it by maintaining productivity and increasing staff morale. We are thankful for a safe six years!

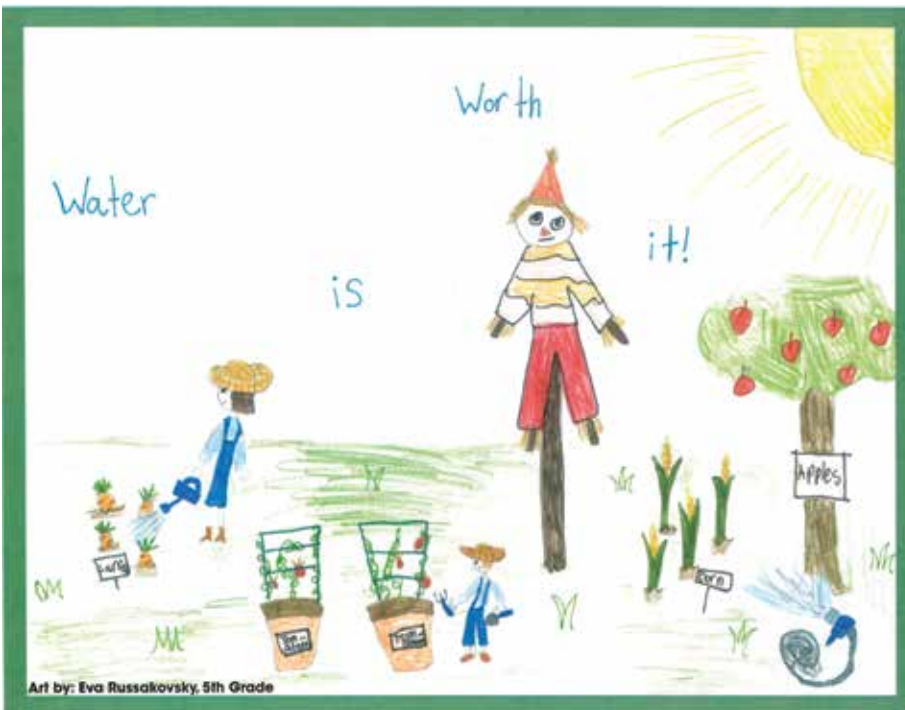
ANNUAL SCHOOL TOUR AND CALENDAR CONTEST

In September 2023, San Andreas Elementary students received a hands-on wastewater treatment plant tour as an ongoing part of the District' School Outreach Program.
